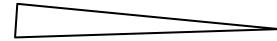

Getting there:

The Carriage Works is situated on the Southern side of Millennium Square, opposite the Civic Hall and just north of Great George Street in the City Centre. Take the lift or stairs up to the Studio from reception (at ground level).

By Car

There are several multistory car parks nearby. Portland Way/Portland Crescent accessible from City Centre loop Junction 4 or Woodhouse Lane. Also, St. John's Centre and the Merrion Centre, adjacent to Junctions 6 and 7.

By Rail

Leeds Station, in City Square is served by East Coast, Northern Rail and Trans Pennine Services. The venue is a 10 – 12 minute walk north out of the main front entrance of the station, across City Square, up Park Row, crossing the Headrow and Great George Street, then turning into Millennium Square.

By Bus

The City Centre Bus Service departs outside the Railway Station main entrance and covers the city in a clockwise direction. The closest stops are Calverley Street, Portland Way and Woodhouse Lane. English National Concessionary Travel Pass holders can travel free on this service.
