In 2017, Hull was 'UK City of Culture'. In that same year Hull New Theatre re-opened after a £16 million refurbishment.

Originally built in 1939 the theatre has undergone several upgrades, but nothing to equal this one. Back-stage areas have been completely rebuilt resulting in a larger stage, and fly tower, with completely new technical systems. Front of house areas have been brought up to date, including increasing the seating capacity by approximately 200.

At the meeting we will learn something of the theatre's history, and the theatre consultants, Charcoalblue, will speak about the technical goals and solutions. We will also have the opportunity for tours of the theatre's technical areas.



Getting there:

By Car:

From the west use the M62, which becomes the A63, and takes you almost to the theatre.

From the south take the A1 and exit at Newark-on-Trent, and take the A15 up to, and over, the Humber bridge. Then take the A63 into Hull.

From the North take the A1(M) and then the M62 and A63.

There are limited pay and display car parking bays nearby, which are free after 6pm. The nearest council car park is Albion Street pay and display car park open Mon-Sun 8am-11pm.

Parking is also available in Princes Quay shopping centre.

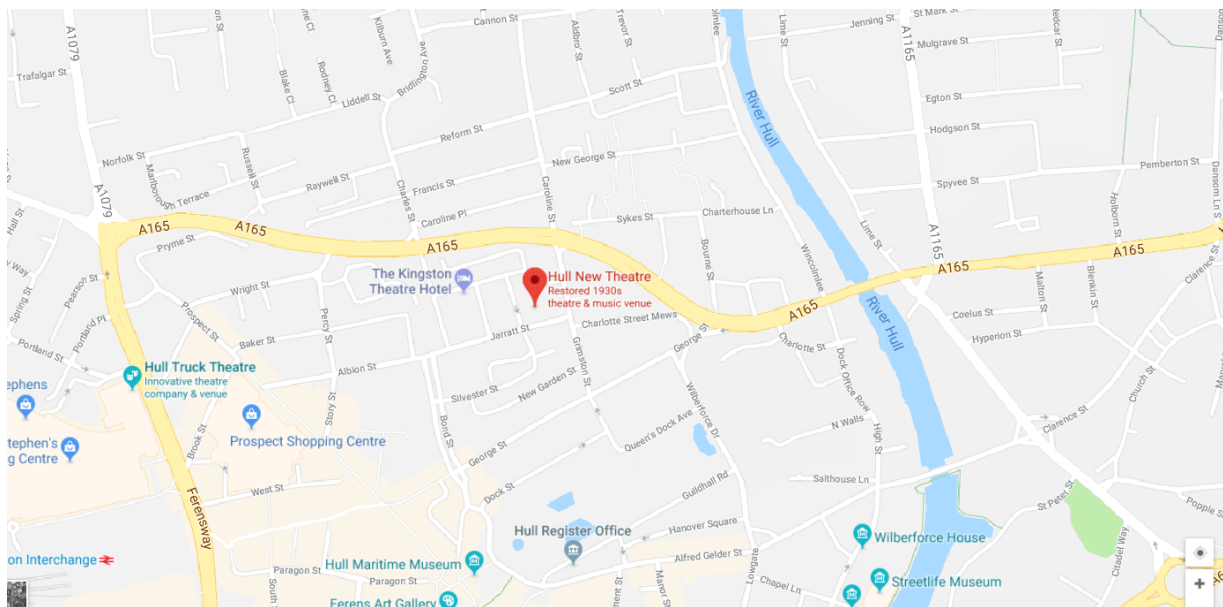
By Public Transport:
