About the Lighting Department



The Lighting Department's vision is to allow each Lighting Designer to experience the same standard of excellence and support to realise their design, regardless of which theatre their production is being staged in.

The department consists of an average of 30 staff working in the following areas:

- Lighting Operations: venue-based operational staff in each of the 3 theatres consisting of Supervisors, Senior Technicians (with either a programming or supervisory bias) and Technicians.
- Lighting Control: who along with the theatre's programmers, look after the theatre's control & networking technology.
- Lighting Resources: run the internal "hire shop" for equipment available to the 3 theatre spaces, supplementing basic rigs for productions. They also take responsibility for events at the NT that require lighting and power such as River Stage, The Deck and Learning events, and support West End transfers and tours where possible.

Contract Type: 22 Month Fixed Term Contract

Hours: An average of either 40 hours per week. 5 out of the 7 days scheduled over a 26 week period. Nominal working hours 08:00 – 23:00 although some ACD work may be required – this is included in the salary and will be scheduled and monitored accordingly. Hours will be scheduled in advance and will be dependent on operational demands over the 5 days. We would be open to a discussion and requests for alternative, part-time hours and work patterns as well a potential job share. Purpose of the Role

This entry-level role provides opportunities for Lighting Technicians to gain professional experience within a large organisation as well as on-the-job training from the National Theatre's Lighting team to help them develop a professional theatre career.

This is not a placement or apprentice position and applicants should have a reasonable level of technical ability as they will be expected to work alongside the NT's in-house teams on a day to day basis, producing and running shows to National Theatre standards.

There is a 3 stage competency progression within Grade 5 and all starters join at Stage 1. You will be assessed at pre-determined intervals during the contract period and should progress up to Stage 2 then to Stage 3.

It is expected that by contract end, you will have received the appropriate training and have the experience to apply for a skilled, professional Theatre Technician job (Grade 4 by NT standards).





Duties and Responsibilities

- Develop and become skilled in the identification, rigging, checking, focusing and operation of all lighting equipment to then effectively participate in fit-ups, rehearsals, changeovers, performances and get-outs on productions and events.
- Learn to ensure good housekeeping by making sure that working areas are clean and tidy.
- Participate with first-line maintenance for productions and non-productions (work lights and house lights) under supervision.
- Learn how to build electrical, mechanical and electronic lighting effects & props including pyrotechnics, as required to specified designs under supervision.
- Learn how to connect equipment to power ('plug and play') used on stage or in rehearsal rooms for productions and rehearsals under supervision.
- Learn how to prepare and maintain accurate plots and records detailing all aspects of performance-related equipment.
- Understand inventory requirements by checking against lists and plans to identify loss or damage
 of lighting and associated items, and notify as appropriate.
- When required, to appear on stage in appropriate clothes to carry out specific lighting activities; and appear in costume to carry out a move or effect on stage.
- Participate in NT training as required for this role.
- Liaise closely with other technical departments and work together to promote a safe working environment and provide a positive Health and Safety Culture.
