Tom originally trained in Stage Management at the Bristol Old Vic Theatre School. He has worked in theatre and entertainment industry for over 30 years, and has extensive experience of Event & Technical Production across many different sectors, both internationally and in the UK.

He currently shares his time between Production Management and Consultancy, and is also a chartered Safety and Health practitioner and IOSH Theatre Advisory Group committee member.

Also on our panel today is Ollie Jeffrey. Ollie is an experienced and established leader within the entertainment industry. Currently he is Head of Production and Technical and the Royall Albert Hall and a member of the PLASA governing body.

He has extensive HR and Health and Safety knowledge, and has recently overseen the implementation of a new sound and rigging solution for the iconic Victorian venue.

Our next speaker is Karl Raw. Joining HSE in 2005 Karl has Regulated in a variety of industrial sectors including fixed premises (factories), construction sites, asbestos, gas, NHS and educational establishments.

Since the end of 2017, he has been part of the HSE's Local Authority Safety Unit Team where the role is one of a policy and engagement one for the entertainment industry which includes Theatre along with film\broadcast and entertainment industries including live events and fairgrounds etc.

The past 14 months has seen a focus upon engaging with industries and Departments across Government in the development of guidance with regard to COVID-19. In addition to this Karl is involved in the COVID Outbreak team which engages and supports the frontline activities of regulators, engages

with co-regulators to identify the role of HSE within outbreaks and review the effectiveness of HSE action to ensure COVID secure work places.

Also joining us is David Kivlin, David has worked for the HSE as a Regulatory Inspector for over 14 years, and until his appointment to the fairgrounds and entertainments sector in 2017, he worked as a frontline Regulatory Inspector within Field Operations Directorate (FOD) covering a diverse number of industries.

In David's current role, his primary responsibility has been stakeholder engagement with the fairground industry. Latterly, in addition to dealing with the normal day to day safety related issues, he has worked closely with the fairground sector throughout the COVID 19 pandemic to ensure that they had the necessary precautions in place to reopen.

This work has included the review of industry specific guidance and providing practical advice on COVID 19 risk assessments and policies to both Local Authorities and fairground operators.
